Amita Kumari is an Assistant Professor in the Department of History at Sido Kanhu Murmu University, Dumka, Jharkhand. Her research interests span migration studies, Adivasi history, and gender studies. Currently, she is pursuing her Ph.D. at Presidency University, Kolkata, where her doctoral research focuses on the colonial history of Santals, an indigenous community in Jharkhand.

Amita has completed two significant research projects on Adivasi women. The first, conducted in 2018 and sponsored by the Indian Association of Women's Studies, was titled "Gendering the Study of Santals: Portrayal, Construction, and Agency of Santal Women." The second project, an action research component of an international collaboration (2021-23), was titled "A Research Study to Further Gender Equality in Higher Education in India."
