Maya John is a labour historian teaching in the University of Delhi, and is currently an elected member of the University's Academic Council. She is also a life member of Centre for Women's Development Studies (CWDS), Delhi. Some of her recent research and publications relate to fields such as mass social movements, political strategies of Left movements, evolution of India's labour laws, the impacts of labour segmentation in the Indian workforce, education policy measures, histories of educational inequalities, and histories of epidemics and epidemiology. She has recently co-edited a book titled Who Cares? Care Extraction and the Struggles of Indian Health Workers (Zubaan Books), and has edited Debating Education in India: Issues and Concerns (Tulika Books and Columbia University Press). She has been associated with different social movements for the last two decades. She has been working with the Domestic Workers' Union in Delhi-NCR, and with unions of sanitation workers, nurses, and teachers.
